1. Describe a character from your novel 10 years from now (what they would be like, where they would be, what they would be doing) in at least 6-8 sentences.	2. Create a chart of the main characters and what they love, want, fear, and hate most.	3. Write a letter to one of the characters about a mistake they made. Give suggestions on what they should have done. Write at least one good paragraph.	4. Create a report card for one of your characters. Give them grades and comments for each subject that you put on their report card.	5. Create a Venn diagram comparing and contrasting a character from the novel and yourself. You must have at least 6 comparisons.
6. Write a paragraph to your teacher explaining why a different book you read is better than this one.	7. If you could give a character a birthday gift, what would you give them and why? Write at least 6-8 sentences explaining.	8. Create a timeline of at least 10 events from your novel.	9. Pick 5 unfamiliar vocabulary words from your book and write their definitions, a synonym, antonym, and sentence for each word.	10. Create an acrostic poem using the title of your novel or a character's name.
11. Explain in at least 6-8 sentences why or why not you think this book will still be read 100 years from now.	12. Create a comic strip from a scene in your novel. Create at least 3 boxes and include dialogue.	13. Write 10 facts about any character from your book.	14. Create a WANTED poster for a villain from your book.	15. Create a word search using at least 10 vocabulary words, character names, places, or other words from your book. Include a word bank.
16. Write down 5 examples of figurative language found in your novel. Include what type of figurative language it is and the page number it can be found on.	17. Choose 2 quotes from your novel and explain them. Write at least 6-8 good sentences.	18. Create a bookmark and decorate it with a scene or quote or other aspect from your novel. Be creative!	19. Write an alternate ending to your novel. Must be at least 6-8 sentences.	20. Write a short rap or song about a theme, character, place, or something else from the novel. Your rap/song must be at least 15 lines long.
21. Create a t-shirt design for your novel. Create a logo or design that relates to your book. It must be detailed and relate to your novel!	22. Create a new title for your book. Explain in 6-8 sentences why you chose this title.	23. Create a collage with pictures and words that relate to your novel.	24. Create a coat of arms for a character in your novel. <i>(a symbol of a family's identity and values)</i>	25. Name 2 external conflicts, 2 internal conflicts, the theme, the climax, title and author of the novel, and who the main characters are.
