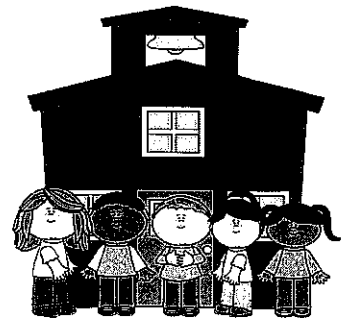


Pre- K 3 Summer Practice Skills

Please review these basic skills with your child over the summer of entering Pre- K3.

- Saying his or her first AND last name.
- Practice colors.
- Practice shapes.
- Sing the alphabet.
- Count to 10.
- Read often. (You read to them, they pretend read.)
- Tell an adult if something is wrong.
- Tell an adult when they need help.
- Take care of basic needs on own (restroom, tissues.)
- Sing or recite nursery rhymes.
- Use scissors and glue.
- Play with Play- Doh.
- Put together simple puzzles.
- Follow two step directions.
- Take turns and share.
- Know their teacher's name
